**From Fr. Peter's Desk
The Presentation of the Lord**

Dear Parish Family:



Today we celebrate the Feast of The Presentation of the Lord. This Feast is rooted within Old Testament traditions. The Book of Exodus stipulated that every firstborn Israelite male, human or animal, belonged to God, "Consecrate to me every firstborn; whatever opens the womb among the Israelites, whether of human being or beast, belongs to me" (Exodus 13:2). Mary and Joseph fulfilled this law by presenting Jesus in the Temple and making an offering. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, Simeon recognizes Jesus as the Messiah, prophesying that "my eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the sight of all the peoples."

What can this feast day bring to us? People come into our lives who may have prophetic purposes, but we may not realize it at the time. This happened to Mary and Joseph as they presented Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem. We are called to contemplate the happenings of our days in prayer and as we do so, we might want to give some thought on how God has placed our loved ones, friends, and coworkers in our lives as testimony of God's great love for us. Remember the internal and external messages that we have heard, throughout the day, that were filled with goodness, truth and beauty, for these are from our God!

The Rosary Group

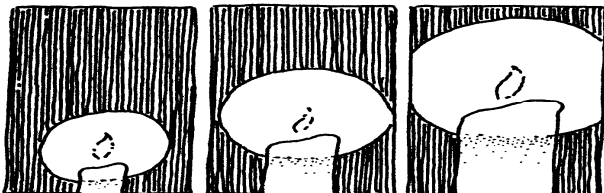
Daily, after the 9AM Mass, in the church we pray the Rosary and Chaplet of Divine Mercy.
