**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
**Fifth Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:



The Prophet Isaiah, in our First Reading today, offers us some sound advice on witnessing to an authentic life, which will in turn attract others to the message. The prophet affirms this vision: "If you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then your light shall rise for you in the darkness". How can we become a more effective light in the darkness? In St. Paul's letter to the followers in Corinth, he shows how his life witnessed to the light of Christ. Paul explains that when he came to Corinth, he did not preach using great rhetorical gifts. Instead, he allowed the Spirit to speak through him. The power of the Spirit transformed his human inadequacies to communicate the message of the crucified and Risen Christ.

In our Gospel reading, Jesus tells his disciples that they are the salt of the earth. Salt permeates food and brings out its flavor, so as Christians we are called to permeate the world and transform its values. Being the light of the world requires us to let his light shine through our lives, drawing others to this light.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Pope Francis describes our evangelizing call to a hurting world that needs encouragement and hope as being able and willing to share God's tender mercy with others, making our communities a place that everyone can feel welcomed, loved, forgiven and encouraging all to live the good life of the Gospel. A good place to start this evangelization is in our church, maybe as an usher, a Eucharistic Minister or other ministry. Jesus is calling us to continue to shine his light of love and compassion. If not us, then who?
