**From Fr. Peter's Desk
Third Sunday of Lent**

Dear Parish Family:



In our First Reading, from the Book of Exodus, God would have had every right to punish the people. They were openly revolting against Moses, complaining that they were worse off than when they were enslaved. Instead, God gives them the water they need to survive in the desert. In our Gospel story, Jesus breaks numerous cultural taboos by interacting with a woman, a Samaritan. In this conversation between the Samaritan woman and Jesus, St. John describes a drama of faith. Jesus engages this woman and accepts her as she is. He leads her deeper into the truth. Faith is, after all, a personal encounter with Christ, and St. John shows how powerful this encounter is and what happens when one is receptive to Jesus.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today's readings illustrate God's transforming power at work. Pope Francis has stressed the missionary character of the Church and the woman at the well typifies this character. By encountering Jesus and allowing him to transform her, she drops everything to tell her friends. Her testimony bears fruit. Like living water, her faith in Jesus flows out from her to transform those around her. Let us pray for the grace to be able to share the love of Jesus with all whom we encounter at the well!
