From Fr. Peter's Desk
Fourth Sunday of Lent

Dear Parish Family:



In our First Reading from the Book of Samuel, the prophet goes to Jesse of Bethlehem to anoint one of his eight sons as king. Although Samuel is impressed by the stature of the eldest son, God rejects him, saying: "Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance, but the Lord looks into the heart". David, the youngest son, is chosen to be anointed. "Like night and day," we say when speaking of two things that are completely different. St. Paul would approve of that idiom, for he contrasts light and darkness in our Second Reading today. While in darkness, the Ephesians were unable or unwilling to realize goodness or truth. With the light of Christ, they gained that insight.

In today's Gospel, Jesus heals a man born blind, which is one of seven signs in St. John's Gospel. It signified that Jesus' power to heal extends beyond physical blindness to spiritual blindness. Although the Pharisees refuse to believe in the miracle of the man regaining his sight, God demonstrates that He often works in ways that human beings refuse to accept.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, in the midst of the current global health crisis, we get the feeling that our world is being plunged into darkness. Today, we hear that Jesus brought light to the darkness of the blind man's world. He can do the same for us. Let us be assured by today's Gospel that Jesus will lead us from the darkness of today's crisis to the light of a new tomorrow. Have faith and trust in God, He will not abandon us!
