### **MARRIAGES:**

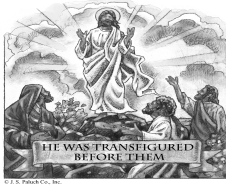
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
**Second Sunday of Lent**

Dear Parish Family:



Our readings today fortify our Lenten journey with the accounts of two journeys. In our First Reading, from the Book of Genesis, God commands Abraham to set out on a journey to a "land that I will show you." Trusting in God, Abram leaves behind his family, friends and homeland.

In our Gospel account of Jesus' Transfiguration, Jesus had revealed to His disciples that He was the Messiah who would bring spiritual liberation through His suffering, death and resurrection. Now He takes His three closest disciples up a mountain where He appears in His risen glory, conversing with Moses and Elijah, who signify the Law and the Prophets. This vision points symbolically to Jesus as the fulfillment of the entire Old Testament. These three disciples were privileged witnesses to Jesus' glory as God's Son.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the experience of the disciples on the mountain, offered them strength for their journey ahead and the message from God, "Listen to him" offers us courage as well. The message is clear: the Risen Christ accompanies us through life's journey, where our sufferings and death will culminate in sharing in the resurrected life. Jesus touches us, just as He had touched His disciples. The awesome presence of God is everywhere! Feeling awestruck lately?
