### **MARRIAGES:**

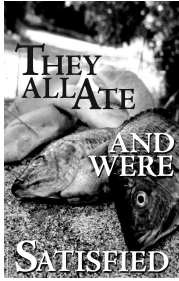
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
**18th Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:



Themes of hunger, satisfaction and abundance pervade today's readings. We are reminded in our First Reading that as God provides food in abundance to satisfy physical hunger, so too does God provide abundant grace in Christ, grace that more than satisfies our spiritual hungers.

In our Second Reading, St. Paul tells us that we should not live in fear from any condemnation because God, who is good and generous, loves in a way that surmounts all and Jesus, as one who has been condemned, is not going to turn around and condemn. The things that worry us such as hardship, persecution and peril actually unite us to Jesus because He has also experienced these things.

We see the love of God in action in today's Gospel. Jesus, although trying to find some quiet place after learning of the death of John the Baptist, is confronted by a vast number of people whom he heals and feeds. We too are called, through the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, to share God's abundant grace with those in need.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the Eucharist that we receive is the source of abundant grace and commits us to live lives of service. Pope Francis explained that those who receive the Eucharist need to be compassionate, just as Jesus is, in sharing himself with us. The Sacrament of the Eucharist calls us to solidarity with the poor. Let us pray for an increase in compassion for the needs of others and the strength to respond in faith.
