MARRIAGES:

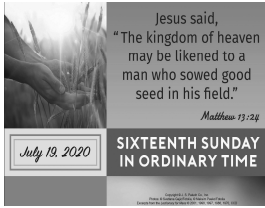
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

Dear Parish Family:



In our First Reading from the Book of Wisdom, we hear portrayed a caring God. This caring God is lenient and is likely to grant repentance. Secure in sovereignty and power, this God is slow to anger.

Our Second Reading from St. Paul to the Romans, Paul is telling us that despite our ignorance and our inability to express ourselves, God's Spirit accompanies us by groaning in us and with us. This groaning of the Spirit is somehow praying for us according to God's will. Like Wisdom, Paul describes a knowing and understanding God.
