MARRIAGES:

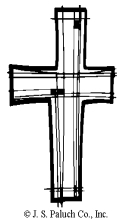
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk
14th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:



In our First Reading from Zechariah, we hear that our expectations often fool us. It was only natural for the early followers of Christ to expect that a king would ride in on horse and chariot, not on a beast of burden without a weapon! It's the law of the spirit that gives up this jealous competition and hostile calculation. With this law of the spirit, God is gracious, merciful and slow to anger (Psalm 145).

St. Paul, in his letter to the Romans, also refers to the law of the spirit of life in Christ. He connects the law of sin and death with the flesh. Paul assures us that God's Spirit dwells in us and if we live by this spirit of the law, we will never die.

Our Gospel reading today addresses us with comforting words, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest". The demands of discipleship are great, but with God's grace they do not become burdensome. After all, our role model, Jesus Christ, is himself meek and humble of heart.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today you have heard Jesus call you to come to him with your burdens and he promises to give you rest. Let us pray for the grace to be able to turn to Him more readily when we are in need and to trust in Him and in his love for us.
