From Fr. Peter's Desk
20th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:



In today's First Reading, we hear the Prophet Isaiah tell his audience, who had recently returned from exile, that foreigners who held to the covenant would be welcome on God's holy mountain, in God's house. Admittance is not based on background, culture, or history, but on one's own faithfulness and service.

It is in a direct line from both Isaiah and Jesus that St. Paul can say to the Romans, "I am the apostle to the Gentiles". Paul had dedicated his ministry to making disciples of all nations, drawing foreigners to the Lord. Pope Francis reminds us that we are a missionary church, exhorting us to go to "the peripheries" to minister to those on the outskirts of society.

The Canaanite woman in today's Gospel broke through a number of boundaries, but it was Jesus who broke through the first one. He ventured into an area where the people worshiped pagan gods, not typically ventured into by the Jews.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, our readings call out to us to make this parish, our faith community, a holy place, a home in which all peoples are welcomed to join us in worship and prayer. Let us pray for each other that we always welcome all strangers and do whatever we can for them, in the name of Jesus.
