From Fr. Peter's Desk
22nd Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:



On this Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time, we hear in our First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah, that when the Prophet heard the word of the Lord, it burned so fiercely in his heart that he had to proclaim it, even though it brought him derision and reproach. Does the word of the Lord burn a fire in our hearts when we hear it? Do we proclaim it, even if it is not what people want to hear at that moment?

St. Paul writes, in his letter to the Romans, that we make a sacrifice when we resist conforming ourselves to the world with which we live. We are called to deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Jesus. Each sign of the cross that we make should remind us of the sacrifices we are called to offer.

When Jesus tells His disciples that He will suffer and die at the hands of the authorities, in today's Gospel, it is too much for Simon Peter. Jesus admonishes him, telling him "you are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do". Of course we cannot know the mind of God but at least we can appreciate this when we face what seems an impossible burden: there is an unknowable perspective that makes this sensible.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, we are often called to make sacrifices that do not seem to make much sense to us. To follow Jesus is not an easy path and yet God plants this call deep within us. Let us pray for one another, asking God to strengthen our resolve to follow Jesus as His faithful disciples.
