MARRIAGES:

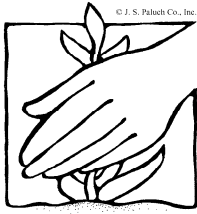
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

From Fr. Peter's Desk
27th Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:



In our First Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, we hear references to God's people as a vine that God has planted deliberately and carefully. Despite God's efforts, something goes wrong with the vine. Isaiah clearly faults Judah, the vine, for failing God's intention with its social injustice in the eighth century BC and threatens its destruction.

St. Paul, in our Second Reading, writes to a Philippian community that is struggling with conflict and division. Paul offers what seems like indispensable ingredients to peace. If we can trust in God's limitless love for us and in God's provision, we can share with God in prayer for our needs, be gentle with each other and live in joy and peace, even when we do not know what life has in store for us.

Matthew's Gospel parable refers to God as a landowner who planted a vineyard and rents it out to tenants. The tenants end up trying to take over the vineyard with violence. The parable ends with a similar declaration as in Isaiah's reading: God expects a harvest or produce of righteous fruits and will not tolerate injustice.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today's readings speak to us of labor and harvests, pointing out that each of us is a laborer in God's vineyard and is expected to bear fruit for the Kingdom of God. Through our work and family life, we are given the privilege of tending a part of God's vineyard.
