**THE THEME**

Today's readings address an all too familiar piece of advice that is easier to talk about than to do: Forgive. We know from experience how hard it is to forgive and how powerful it is to be forgiven. That Jesus was even asked about it indicates that it is not a behavior enacted easily. His response reflects our need to be instructed about it. Forgiveness is not usually our first response to real or perceived hurts or injustices, and it may require our commitment to live as totally new people in Christ. But, boundless forgiveness may be the greatest gift we can ever give one another and ourselves.

**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
**24th Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:



On this Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, in our First Reading from the Book of Sirach, we hear that “the sinner hugs (wrath and anger) tight,” refusing to let go of their visceral reaction to being wronged. Instead, we must learn to embrace the golden rule, forgiving one another as we want to be forgiven. Forgiveness opens the door for reconciliation.

In our Second Reading, St. Paul reinforces that we belong to God even with the ultimate difference and divider: life and death. Since Jesus has demolished the dividing difference between the living and the dead, we should no longer let other differences divide us.

In our Gospel reading, we hear the message that offense can create division and enmity between persons. We are reminded, in today’s parable, that we should do for one another what God has done for us. We need to remember how good and merciful God is to us, be grateful for that mercy, and be gracious to one another.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today’s Scripture readings recall the centrality of mercy and forgiveness in the Christian life. We who have received mercy must, in turn, extend mercy to others through words and actions, as individuals and as a Church. We must abide by our Lord’s prayer, “forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us”. It is not always an easy thing to do but with God’s grace, we can live up to our role in His plan for all of us.
