**From Fr. Peter's Desk**  
**25th Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:



We get some great counsel today in our First Reading from the Book of Isaiah. "Seek the Lord while He may be found, call Him while He is near". We come together today to seek the Lord in word and sacrament, knowing that He can be found in scripture, in the Eucharist, and in each other.

St. Paul was in prison when he wrote today's Second Reading and probably unsure of what would happen to him next. He had spent the last twenty years of preaching the Word of God, which included three missionary journeys through dozens of towns and villages. He was ready to meet the Lord, if that was his fate, but more than willing to continue his ministry if that was what God intended. Whichever way it went, he was willing to magnify Christ in his person as he increased Christ's church.

"It's not fair!", say the day laborers who worked all day only to find out that they made not a penny, more than those who worked for only an hour. From our perspective, that does seem quite unfair but Isaiah reminds us that our thoughts are not God's thoughts nor are our ways, His ways. God's generosity and mercy are infinite. This parable is meant to focus on the landowner's generosity by juxtaposing two economies to make a statement about drastic change or complete reversal.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, jealousy and envy are often based on an understanding that if one has more, than another has less. But today's Gospel points to an understanding and appreciation that God's generosity and mercy are infinite. We are Jesus' agents here on earth and are called to spread God's mercy in the love, time and care we give to others. Sharing these gifts leads others to know the infinite love and mercy of God.

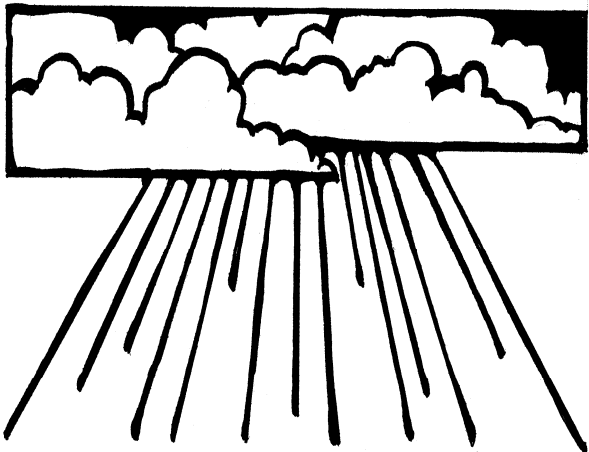
