From Fr. Peter's Desk
23rd Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family:




In our First Reading on this Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Prophet Ezekiel presents God's people as sentinels: they have responsibilities to guard Israel's safety by sharing God's words so others will have a chance to make their own decisions.

St. Paul, in his Letter to the Romans, explains that what fulfills "the law" is an excessive love or generosity towards one's neighbor. Paul has given a more demanding imperative in Romans 12:17-18: "Do not repay anyone evil for evil. . . live at peace with all." Love may make one vulnerable, but that is what we are called to be.

In today's Gospel, Matthew writes about Jesus' teaching on how His followers should treat each other. Matthew's Christianity is not individualistic; it requires patience and understanding toward those who have committed an offense or sin against a person. He expresses great faith in the Christ-following community, which is blessed with Christ's presence and spirit.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, this week's readings call us to confront a difficult, but important, reality: conflict is inevitable and is found even among like-minded believers. The Gospel shows us that we are responsible for one another and that the choices that we make have social consequences. We have opportunities to be a reconciling presence in the world today. Today's world needs our reconciling presence. Let us pray for the strength and courage to be that presence wherever we can.
