Dear Parish Family:

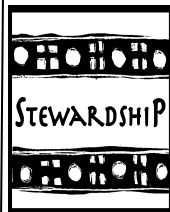


In our First Reading from the Book of Revelation, John tells of the 144,000 being sealed for God out of the twelve tribes as well as a great multitude, worshipping and praising. Like the Lamb and because of the Lamb (Jesus) they have been washed in blood; the Lamb's blood also works, ironically, to wash and purify this great multitude.

In our Second Reading, John gives us a promise of hope and vindication. Though unrecognized by the world as God's children, we are loved by God. John then continues with the metaphor of children and suggests that we will not only witness God's full self-revelation but also grow to be like God. In our Gospel, Jesus teaches the Beatitudes, which shows us the path to holiness is found in unexpected circumstances that call forth acts of self-giving. The Beatitudes describe the mystery of holiness, that true happiness is found in acts of self-giving.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today we celebrate All Saints Day. This day is dear to the hearts of the faithful for it gives us a glimpse of God's promise of eternal life for all who put their hope in the Lord. It is with this promise of eternal life that we can celebrate the lives of all our departed loved ones tomorrow, November 2nd on All Souls Day.
