Dear Parish Family:



In Scripture, images of abundance and feasting point to the gift of God's grace. The Prophet Isaiah uses the illustration of rich food and choice wines in describing heaven and the graces that are bestowed to all who enter.

St. Paul, in our Second Reading, experienced both prosperity and paucity and has learned the secret that Christ is sufficient and can strengthen him to face any situation. God, for Paul, is one who will meet our every need.

In our Gospel reading, St. Matthew compares the kingdom of heaven to a king and his lavish feast for his son's wedding. This parable of the wedding feast offers images of the grace made present to us through the sacraments. In the abundant feast of the Eucharist, God provides food that strengthens life in us. In baptism, God provides the garment as well, clothing us in holiness and enlivening the Holy Spirit's power in us so that we might accept the invitation to the feast.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, we are invited to a feast today. We gather around the table of the Lord, summoned by the Holy Spirit, to share in this Eucharistic meal with our fellow parishioners. May this feast nourish and sustain us as we go forth in joy to continue building the kingdom of God in our little corner of the world, and beyond.
