**From Fr. Peter's Desk
30th Sunday In Ordinary Time**

Dear Parish Family:



In our First Reading from the Book of Exodus, God commands the Chosen People to act fairly and compassionately to their neighbor and warns them of the consequences if they do not. The reading emphasizes God's attentiveness to the pleas of those most in need.

In our Second Reading from St. Paul to the Thessalonians, Paul emphasizes the welcoming of others as a marker of discipleship that deserves emulation from others. Relations among people, as we have seen in the other passages of today, define discipleship and human relationship with God.

Our Gospel reading from St. Matthew, Jesus responds to those who want to honor God but bypass their needy neighbors. Jesus reminds them that mercy comes before sacrifice.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus tells his disciples that the greatest commandment is the love of God and of neighbor. There is neither opposition nor separation between these two loves. One cannot have one without the other. Let us pray for the grace to treat our neighbor as we treat ourselves so that we can be like the Thessalonians, whom St. Paul calls "a model for all the believers."

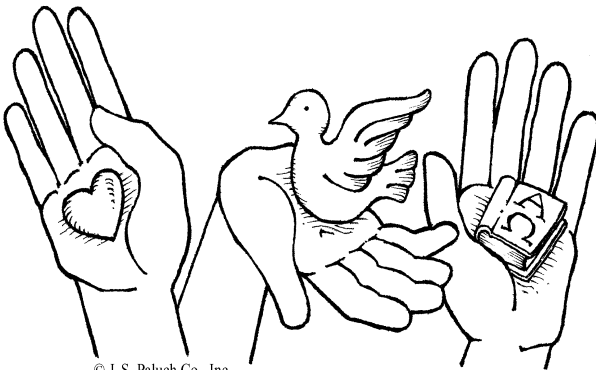
The Rosary Group
