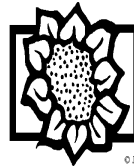

Dear Parish Family:



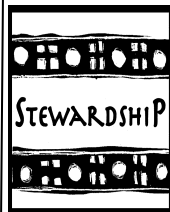
We hear, in our First reading from Proverbs, a man finds a trustworthy and praise-worthy partner, one whose value is "beyond pearls." As we listen to this reading, we should consider how we can become more trustworthy and praiseworthy in the eyes of God and those whose perspective we value.

In our Second Reading, from St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, St. Paul assures us as Christians that we are "children of the light and children of the day." In our Christian journey of life, as Christ's disciples, we constantly learn to shed the ways of darkness. This path that we are called to follow leads to the everlasting light of heaven.

In the Gospel reading today, the master showed trust in his servants by giving them the talents to work with. The master wanted to see if his servants used their talents productively rather than just banking on the interest from the bank. The point of the story begs us to ask ourselves if we are worthy of God's trust in us, using our God given talents to do more than just earn interest?

My brothers and sisters in Christ, today's readings challenge us to consider how we make use of the gifts that God has entrusted to us.
