MARRIAGES:

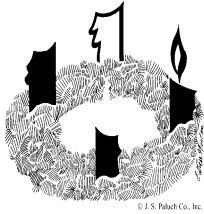
Parishioners arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the ceremony and before arranging the social plans.

**From Fr. Peter's Desk
First Sunday of Advent**

Dear Parish Family:




Our First Reading today from the Prophet Isaiah, dates from a time after the honeymoon period that followed the return from exile. The Israelites question and recall glories that the Lord once performed for the nation. They surrender themselves anew and, despite the possibility of rejection, plead longingly for God to appear.

St. Paul, in our Second reading, writes to the Corinthian Church, which will learn in this letter how woefully unprepared the apostle think it is: theological errors, unethical practices etc. But Paul, in the letter's beginning, celebrates the fact that for all their faults, the Corinthians are nevertheless a true Christian community. He reminds them that God alone keeps them faithful.

In our Gospel reading, Mark's account stresses the need for constant watchfulness among the disciple-servants, who must account for their actions. Again the Lord reminds his disciples, as well as us, to "Keep awake, for none of us know the time that the Lord will come for us."

My brothers and sisters in Christ all people fall short of God's expectations of them, But in love, our Lord does not harden his heart against us but makes possible a way for us to gain his presence again. As we gather in his name today, let us contemplate how we can prepare to receive Jesus even when we least expect him.
