Dear Parish Family:




We hear, in our First Reading from the Book of Wisdom, that those who seek wisdom will not be disappointed because wisdom desires to be accessible.

In St. Paul's letter the Thessalonians, we are reminded that we, as Christians, do not have to "grieve like the rest, who have no hope". We are blessed with hope, hope in the promise of life everlasting and that our loved ones, who have passed away already, dwell in the presence of the Lord.

In today's Gospel reading the wise, like the foolish, all fall asleep waiting for bridegroom but the wise brought both lamps and oil in case the wait was longer than expected. Delayed by the wise sending the foolish off to buy oil for their lamps, the foolish end up being shut out by the bridegroom, who refuses to share the joy of his wedding banquet with latecomers. The message is clear, keep ourselves prepared, live our lives as His disciples because only those who put on Christ and light the way are welcomed into the Kingdom of Heaven.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, both of our New Testament readings today remind us that we are called to face the reality of death with hope, wisely recognizing the longing within us to be in God's holy presence and the necessity of making ourselves ready for this anticipated future.
