**The Holy Family of Jesus,  
Mary and Joseph**



Dear Parish Family:

Our First Reading from Genesis and that from the Gospel of Luke, present us with scenes in the lives of two important families. In the Book of Genesis, we hear of Abram's frustration at not having fathered a child but because Abram puts his trust in God, the Lord took note of Sarah (Abrams wife) and she gave birth to their long awaited son.

Luke's Gospel reading tells us of the presentation of Jesus in the Temple. Even though Simeon and Anna are depicted as having long awaited the coming of this child, Mary and Joseph are described as being "amazed at what was said of Him". The Family returns to Nazareth and the child Jesus grew and became strong, filled with wisdom and the favor of God was upon Him.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, through faith, Abraham and Sarah conceived and because of his faith, Simeon lived to see the Savior. The holiness of the Holy Family increased through acts of faith.
