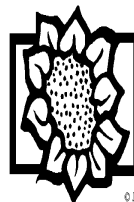

The Baptism of The Lord**



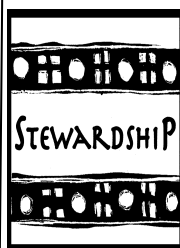
Dear Parish Family:

In our First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah, we hear the invitation “all who are thirsty are invited to come and be nourished, to come and be satisfied by God”. In return for his gentle care, God expects that his disciples listen to his word and live it. “My word shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end of which I sent it”. Through God’s Son, Jesus, we have heard His Word and must now be bearers of that Word in our everyday lives.

Today’s Gospel describes the baptism of Jesus in startling detail. St. Mark offers to all of us an explicit invitation as he allows us to experience this moment of Jesus’ baptism. Through our baptism, we are given hope. For we Christians, the immediate fruit of hope is joy. Find reasons for hope in your life and allow that hope to give you joy.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, God invites each of us to draw closer to Him and to allow Him to nourish us. We are God’s beloved children, for we have accepted the way of the Gospel as our way of life. Let us pray for each other that as we live the life that Jesus calls us to, we will be sustained on our journey of faith by both the grace of God and the love and support of one another.
